Setting a target for total carbon emissions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - set a carbon neutrality target with a timeline - set carbon emissions reduction target with a timeline 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -50% carbon neutrality by 2035, and 100% by 2050, across entire group. -Reduce carbon emissions by 25% by end-2025 relative to 2019 baseline. -50% of new build projects to be carbon neutral by 2025.

Developing renewable energy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - set a renewable energy adoption target with a timeline - install renewable energy generating equipment (e.g. solar panel, solar hot water system) where possible - participate in the Feed-in Tariff Scheme - purchase Renewable Energy Certificates 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Hotels will be required to increase share of renewable energy in their energy mix by 50% by 2030. -Hotels are encouraged to install on-site renewable energy generating equipment, when feasible. -New build projects are encouraged to install on-site renewable energy generating equipment, when feasible. -Hotels encouraged to purchase renewable energy certificates.

Webinars are organized to educate and advocate for energy saving. -Smart building technologies i.e. Building Management Systems, Guestroom Management Systems, Lighting control systems etc. are implemented in new hotels, and included in capital plans for existing ones.

Development of district cooling system	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - adopt high efficiency chillers 	<p>-Cooling plant design is of high importance for our new hotel construction. As available and economically feasible, district cooling may be used. If this is not a suitable solution, on-site chiller plant has to use state of the art high efficiency chillers, or other efficient cooling systems i.e. VRF, heat-pumps etc.</p>

Controlling the use of single-use plastics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - set a plan for minimising the use of single-use plastics, preferably with a target and a timeline - reduce the use of single-use plastic packaging - request on-site caterers and food business tenants to use reusable and durable cutleries and food containers for eat-in customers, and avoid distributing disposable plastic tableware for takeaways - install filtered water dispensers to reduce the use of plastic water bottles - offer single-use toiletries on request only 	<p>Single-use plastics elimination:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Guestroom amenities (wet and dry) -100% sustainable wet amenities by 2022 -100% sustainable dry amenities by 2022 -F&B service (straws, stirrers, to-go containers etc.) -Water bottles (reusable, aluminum, glass, water bottling plants etc.)
